Celebrate the New Year at the AGGV's Winter Exhibition Celebration on Friday, January 16 from 5:00 pm to 9:00 pm. This free event celebrates the launch of a new season of exhibitions at the Gallery: *Fifty Shades of Ink: Ink Paintings from the AGGV Collection*, curated by Dr. Heng Wu, AGGV Curator of Asian Art; *Dangerous Beauty: The Prints of Albrecht Dürer*, curated by Steven McNeil, AGGV Chief Curator & Director of Exhibitions, and ਸੀਸੇਚ਼ਤਰੇਚ | sheeshe 'ch tharer | a crack in the mirror, organized and circulated by The Reach Gallery Museum; guest curated by Sajdeep Soomal.
